

When I gave him the book, he gripped my now-free hand and said, "That tells me a lot about your character."


I've thought about that sentence quite often in the six weeks since that event. I'm a man of words. I've always been good on my feet; my list of publications shows I can put thoughts on paper.

I've realized how powerful words can be. I also need occasional reminding that words aren't everything—in fact, they may not be as important as our actions.




